The "Paduan Polyphonic Octet" was founded eleven years ago by Bruno Pasut with the main purpose of reviving, in a manner at once authentic and congenial, works of the golden period of vocal polyphony - the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. It has since acquired a considerable reputation in Italy and many European countries, thanks to the qualities of its individual members and to the vocal structure of the ensemble as a whole, which is unique in Italy. The repertoire encompasses sacred and profane compositions of Palestrina, Gabrieli, Gesualdo da Venosa and many other old composers, and occasional excursions are made into the twentieth century.

For today's programme the Octet has chosen what is perhaps one of the most delightful examples of the "madrigale dialogico": the *Pazzia senile* of Adriano Banchieri, a monk from Bologna. The composition takes the form of the "Commedia dell' Arte", adopting some of its archetypal character, and the parodistic intention of Banchieri is evident throughout.
